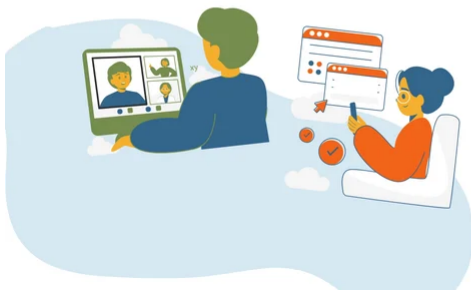

 **Highlights from our workshops**



Workshop in Ireland

The Digital4All Workshop, held on 7 June 2025 at University College Dublin (UCD) as part of the **UCD Science Festival**, was a lively and engaging event promoting **inclusive digital education and literacy**. It brought together educators, students, industry professionals, and members of the public to explore practical ways to make digital learning more equitable.

The workshop showcased the project's main results — the Digital4All Toolkit, Digital Repository, and Dissemination materials — highlighting how they support digital inclusion across Europe.

Hosted at the O'Brien Science Building, the four-hour session welcomed **57 participants**, including teachers, students, UCD staff, and representatives from the technology and education sectors. Through collaboration with the UCD Science Festival, the event achieved strong visibility thanks to its presence on the festival website, social media promotion, direct invitations, and on-campus displays.

Participant feedback was overwhelmingly positive: teachers praised the practicality of the Toolkit and Repository, while students enjoyed the storytelling-based activities that made digital inclusion engaging and accessible. The interactive format, group discussions, and networking moments fostered a vibrant exchange of ideas.

Overall, the workshop successfully raised awareness about digital inclusion, strengthened collaboration between schools, universities, and industry, and reinforced UCD's leadership in this field. Inspired by its success, teachers plan to integrate Digital4All resources into their classrooms, and partners are preparing new workshops to continue the momentum.



Workshop in Greece

The Digital4All Workshop was held on 8 September 2025 at TIF HELEXPO 2025, within the IHU pavilion in Thessaloniki. Participants gave highly positive feedback, highlighting the **quality and relevance of the content**, the **usefulness of project tools**, and the **future value of the results**.

Being part of **TIF HELEXPO**, Greece's leading exhibition and cultural organisation, gave the event greater visibility and outreach. It enabled **direct engagement with students, teachers, and families** in an inclusive setting that promotes **digital literacy and education**.

The workshop presented the project's key results — the Toolkit, Training Programme, and Digital Repository — and brought together 30 participants from higher education, schools, and industry. This collaboration with TIF HELEXPO provided venue support, co-promotion, and alignment with its educational mission, amplifying the **impact and diversity** of the event.



Workshop Belgium (held in Malta)

On 10 September, All Digital hosted the Digital4All workshop during the 18th **All Digital Summit** in Valletta, Malta, themed *“Summit of Educated Digital Citizens: Empowering Connected Generations.”*

The Summit is All Digital's flagship annual event, gathering key stakeholders in digital education, inclusion, and skills from across Europe. Taking advantage of this unique platform, the workshop titled **“Digital Learning for All: Creating Inclusive Experiences”** reached not only participants from Belgium but also a diverse European audience.

Using the engaging metaphor of a party to explore digital inclusion — *“Let's think about digital learning as a party. Who's in, and who's left outside? Let's redesign the invitation so everyone feels welcome”* — the session introduced the principles of **Universal Design for Learning (UDL)** through group-based interactive activities. Each group was invited to apply one UDL principle to a specific learning scenario.

The workshop concluded by sharing the main milestones and resources developed through the Digital4All project. Participants highly appreciated its interactive and dynamic format, which encouraged collaboration and practical reflection on how to make digital learning truly inclusive.



Upcoming Workshop in Cyprus

The Digital4All Workshop in Cyprus will take place on **24 November 2025** at **CASA College** in Nicosia. The event will bring together around 30 participants, including teachers, students, college staff, and community stakeholders, to explore inclusive approaches to digital education and literacy.

Hosted by CASA College, a multicultural higher education institution located in the heart of Nicosia, the workshop will build on previous Digital4All trainings and pilot implementations in Cyprus, which successfully tested the Toolkit, Training Course, and eLearning Platform with higher education staff and students.

Participants will engage in **storytelling-based activities**, collaborative discussions, and hands-on sessions to apply inclusive design principles and identify practical ways to use the Digital4All Toolkit and Repository in classrooms and community learning environments.

The workshop aims to **strengthen collaboration** between schools, universities, and local organisations, reinforcing CASA College's role as a bridge institution and inspiring future initiatives that extend the impact of Digital4All across Cyprus and beyond.
