Since the 1980s, technology has steadily integrated into education, but the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020 revolutionised the landscape, making digital technologies essential for teaching and learning. However, this shift has **highlighted significant inequalities**.

To address these challenges, the Digital4All project brings together six partners from Belgium, Cyprus, Finland, Greece, and Ireland. 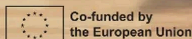

The next exciting step in the Digital4All project is the development of a **training course** for higher education faculty and staff.

The training course will offer with hands-on opportunities to adopt Universal Design strategies and practices that facilitate all university students' participation in digital learning, using a Universal Design Framework.

Specifically, they will learn how to **adopt strategies** across the whole spectrum of **digital education**: in terms of **organization, teaching, learning, assessment, support, monitoring, evaluation of programmes, technology use and adaptations, collaboration and networking**, and their own continuous professional development.
