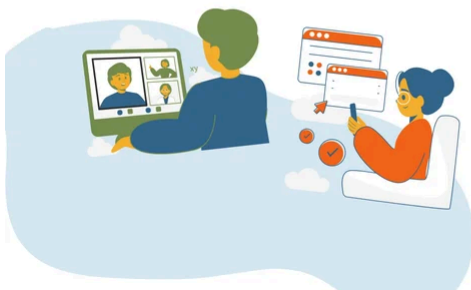

The Digital4All final conference took place on 20 November in Vaasa, Finland, with the option to join remotely. The event was a great success, bringing together about fifty participants who were active and genuinely interested in the topics presented.
